We managed a **Christmas Gift Sale** and raised over **£550**, this is something that we are going to keep going forward as it was very popular.

The sales that happened over the Christmas period in collaboration with WPSA (silent auction, sweets, books and cards) brought in an extra £273. Thank you to everyone who helped to make all the items that were sold and those who bought them.

Tamar's wonderful girls, Alyssa and Emilie, raised a staggering **£216**, which was shared with WPSA, by doing a sponsored walk after learning how much fundraising we have had to cancel this year (and last). Thank you so much girls for this very kind gesture.

What we spent the money on so far this year:

We have not had a lot of opportunities so far this year to spend funds but we have bought a few things for the school.

Approximately £180 was spent on **books** for all of the children to enjoy.

Approximately £600 was spent on wall maps and atlases for every classroom.

FoSM funded the **school pantomime** which every child enjoyed along with **popcorn and a drink**. All children were also given a **Christmas present** for the children's Christmas dinner this year, this came to approximately £340.

All in all, approximately £1,000 has been spent by FoSM on the children so far this year ©
