

## PE and Sport Premium Proposed Spending 2019-20

This year St Mark's have received a PE grant of £22,500. The grant is being used in accordance with the relevant conditions i.e. we do not employ coaches or specialist teachers to cover PPA with this budget, the money comes from the school staff budget.

<b>Items</b>	<b>Cost</b>	<b>Impact</b>
Change 4 Life club	£500	Provide a sports coach to run weekly sessions for those less active to ensure all children have the opportunity to lead active and healthy lifestyles.
Play Leaders	£500	To develop leadership and a sense of responsibility for a range of children in the school. To encourage all children to lead an active lunchtime (supervised by a coach).
PE Equipment	£8,500	To provide suitable equipment for all areas of PE to enable all children to gain the most out of their PE lessons. Repairing any existing equipment to ensure it is safe and up to date with regulations. Buying new equipment to replace anything that has perished or that is required to learn a new sport.
School Sports Events	£3000	Whole school involvement. PLC/Academy involvement. Children exposed to new sports/activities. Parental involvement.
External tournaments - including transport, supervision and kit	£4500	Providing children with the opportunity to be able to partake in festivals, tournaments, competitively/non-competitively in collaboration with our local link secondary school, Wyvern St Edmund's.
PE provision in terms 5 and 6.	£4000	Maintenance of the swimming pool. Half the class learn swimming at a time to fully utilise the time in the pool, while the other half learn Tennis with a coach. The aim is to decrease the number of non-swimmers by the end of Year 6.
PE Curriculum	£500	A new PE scheme will be introduced to provide teachers with a clear progression of skills across the year groups and also enable the children to learn new skills.
Staff Training	£1000	To upskill teachers by providing staff meetings for training or releasing the PE specialist to team teach/shadow to ensure the children get the best out of their PE lessons.
